One of the most honored roles a man or woman can play in Jewish communal life is to belong to a *Chevra Kadisha*. Literally a "Holy Society," the *Chevra Kadisha* is responsible for preparing a body for a Jewish funeral. This involves special rituals of *tahara* (purification), cleansing, and dressing the body in *tachrichim* (white burial shrouds). For reasons of modesty, men and women prepare bodies of the same gender. Care for a body is performed with the utmost respect, including asking for forgiveness from the deceased in case anything was neglected. These beautiful and loving rituals are intended to give honor to the soul of the deceased, which is believed to still be present, as well as to convey reverence to God, the ultimate Master of life and death.

After burial, the relatives of the deceased enter into the weeklong period of mourning called *shiv'ah*. Traditionally, the *Chevra Kadisha* would support the family by arranging meals and organizing *minyanim* (religious services) in the home.

Although it is not generally known, most Jewish communities, including the South Bay, have at least one *Chevra Kadisha*. A Jewish burial society was historically often the first organization that would be formed in a Jewish community - preceding

a synagogue, a mikvah, and other institutions.

One of the reasons that belonging to a *Chevra Kadisha* is so highly esteemed is that the act of preparing a body for burial is considered to be a *chesed shel emet* ("loving act of truth"), a deed that can never be repaid by the one on whose behalf it is performed. The expression is based on Genesis 47:29, when Jacob asks Joseph to perform an act of "*chesed v'emet*" ("love and truth") by taking his body out of Egypt for burial in the land of Israel.

Jewish tradition considers this act to be an emulation of God. In the Talmud, Rabbi Simlai teaches that the "Torah begins and ends with acts of kindness... It concludes with an act of kindness, as is written (Deut. 34:6); 'And He (God) buried him (Moses) in the valley.'" (Sotah 14A) Based upon this teaching, the date of Moses' death, the seventh of Adar, is especially important to *Chevra Kadisha* members. That day is observed as a fast to atone for any disrespect that may have been shown towards the dead in the previous year. Afterwards, members gather for a celebratory feast, often inviting honored guests.

In recent years, the responsibility for supporting families during the week of *shiv'ah* has shifted to synagogues. One of my greatest privileges as a Rabbi is being able to help mourners prepare for a funeral and observe *shiv'ah*.

At a time of intense loss and unsettled emotions, the importance of our ancient Jewish rituals becomes most clear. Mourners are profoundly comforted by having prescribed, richly symbolic actions that express and evoke the complex emotions of grief.

While Congregation Sinai does not have its own *Chevra Kadisha*, we do have members who consider it to be a special responsibility and privilege to support those who experience loss. As our synagogue has grown, the need to involve more members of our community in the *mitzvah* of *chesed shel emet* has increased. I want to invite you to join Sinai's newly formed *Nechamah* (comfort) Committee, led by members Rita Jacobson and Bob Tobin. Members of the *Nechamah* Committee will be the first ones called upon to help mourners prepare for a funeral and go through the week of *shiv'ah*. There will be a training session on Thursday, February 10 at 7:30 pm, at which participants will learn about Jewish practices of *nichum aveilim* (comforting mourners) and find out how our tradition supports those who experience loss.

This is an opportunity for you to be involved in one of the greatest of *mitzvot*, and a chance to participate in something truly meaningful. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact Rita, Bob, or myself. Being on the *Nechamah* Committee does not require any prior knowledge or experience. All that is needed is a caring heart. I hope you will be able to join us.

Meet Our B'nei Mitzvah

When our young people become B'nei Mitzvah, it is an opportunity for the entire Sinai community to take pride in their accomplishments. This month at Sinai, we will be celebrating as Shira Kahn-Samuelsan becomes our newest adult member.

When I was little, synagogue was a place to go to be with my friends so we could play red light green light. As I got older and stayed in services for longer periods of time, I wondered how the big people could read Torah. I also wondered what they were saying. Even last year, a Bat-Mitzvah seemed like a mystical thing that was never going to happen to me. I would watch my friends get Bar or Bat Mitzvah'ed, and I could not believe that I would be Bat-Mitzvah'ed in a matter of months. Now it is my turn to have the honor of chanting Torah and the Haftarah, and I could not be more excited. I finally understand the mystery of chanting Torah and I am proud to take my place as an adult in the Jewish community.

The family of our January Bat Mitzvah warmly invites the entire congregation to join them for Shabbat services and to celebrate afterwards with a Kiddush luncheon.

Attending Shabbat services is a tremendously important part of every Jewish child's education. One of the most important reasons to attend Shabbat services, and the reason that Congregation Sinai has established expectations for all Religious School and day school students in grades K-7, is to build community. I always make sure that every Sunday and Tuesday during religious school, and of course on Shabbat, I spend time talking to every student, even if it is just for one minute. I want every child at Sinai to feel that this synagogue is a place in which he or she matters and is special. If we are successful at cultivating a community amongst all our Sinai families, that sense of community will remain with our students later in life, including when they are making their own decisions as adults about being involved in the Jewish community. The moments that we see each other in shul are at least as important as when we come together for formal Jewish learning. I love having so many opportunities to interact Jewishly with the youth of our community,

whether it is at services, playing in the courtyard, or hanging out in my office. One of my best experiences in the short time I have been here occurred one Shabbat. I had so much fun laughing and running around as I played football in the Sinai courtyard with several of our students.

Another important reason to attend Shabbat services regularly is to help students learn how to pray and become familiar with the Sinai service. We always encourage children to participate in and help lead parts of the service. Attending synagogue on Shabbat also puts into practice what students have been learning at Sinai Religious School and Yavneh Day School.

One way students can fulfill their Shabbat attendance requirement is by participating in our monthly Torah N' Tefillah (TNT) program. TNT, Sinai's junior congregation, is designed for children in grades three

through seven. We experiment with new melodies, and learn about what the prayers mean and where they come from. All prayers are led by students. The Torah reading and teachings are led by teen volunteers

If you have a teen in grades 9-12 who is interested in helping lead skits, tell stories based on the Torah portion, lead or teach prayers, or chant Torah, please let me know. One of my goals for TNT is keep our teens involved in the synagogue after their B'nei Mitzvah. Helping to lead TNT is also a great way to collect hours for high school volunteer requirements.

Shabbat service attendance expectations for students in each grade are as follows:

- K-2nd Grade - 7 services
- 3rd Grade - 8 services
- 4th Grade - 10 services
- 5th Grade - 12 services
- 6th Grade - 16 services
- 7th Grade - attend all TNT programs

I keep track of who comes to services each week by having a personalized index card for every Sinai Child. When I see a child in services, I put a sticker on his or her card. Parents, please encourage your child to come say "Shabbat Shalom" to me so that I know to put a sticker on his/her card.

We will honor all of the students who have fulfilled their expectations at an end of year ceremony.

I look forward to seeing all of you in services!
