

Rabbi's Message

As we head into the summertime, many of us are looking forward to taking some time to

relax, go on vacation, and/ or slow down from what has been a busy year. The slower pace of summer also gives us an opportunity to take stock of the many blessings in our lives, and appreciate what we have. Sometimes, we find that our greatest blessings go unnoticed and unappreciated Rabbi Josh right in front of our faces.

As you know, many visitors join us for Sinai programs and services during the course of the year. I am especially proud of the many ways in which our community welcomes guests. After one of this year's B'nei Mitzvah, a non-Jewish visitor wrote to the parents about the experience in our shul, reflecting on both the meaning and power of Jewish ritual as well as the warmth of our community. I would like to share an excerpt from our guest's impres-

"...I loved the feeling of continuity, knowing that these same rituals – more or less – have been conducted throughout the years. I loved how so many family members and friends were included, as well as how the attendees ran the gamut from the smallest children (who seemed to be tolerated as well as integrated to whatever degree possible in the service) to the elderly, who were treated with such respect. I loved the singing... I also appreciated how significant [your child's B. Mitzvah] was and how many people came from such distances to be there - what a statement that makes about the love and devotion of your circle. I also liked the rabbi – his enthusiasm and genuineness. I liked the part where people could request prayers for the ill - I almost went up for my aunt, and probably should have - as well as the acknowledgement of those in mourning. Even in that moment of celebration – maybe especially in that moment – it was so profound to me that there was time taken for reflection about our responsibility to others, our place in the world, and there was no shying away from the whole range of human experience from the celebratory to the grieving. I think it's something that I have been missing in my life, and it was important to take that time to get away from the busyness and make time for what was important..."

How many of us take the time to appreciate these aspects of our Shabbat morning services? Sometimes an outside pair of eyes sees things that familiarity causes us to take for granted. We are blessed to be in such a wonderful community. This summer, let's take the time to look with new eyes at our community, our families, and the many blessings around us that we overlook every day. Have a restful, rejuvenating, and enlightening summer.

President's Message

[David Fernandez delivered this address at the Annual Meeting, on May 15, 2011.]

For those of you who don't know me well, my profession is sales. The thing I like about sales is that you always know where you stand. We are constantly measured by the quota we carry and know how we are doing against that quota at any

time. There is no quota at Congregation Sinai, but we do have a budget, and I am proud to say this year will be completed above our current fiscal plan. This comes from a lot of hard work: our staff is always careful about how we spend our money, our building is new and strong and thankfully requires little maintenance.

The nursery school, led by Director Miki Gurantz, had another successful year not only educating the smallest of our community but exceeding their financial plan. Thank you, Miki, for running such a great Nursery School.

In the last 12 months, we have had 52 Shabbat services, 2 aufrufs, 5 baby naming and brit milahs, and 3 conversions, and we are celebrating with 12 B'nei Mitzvah families of the class of 5771. We have spent some wonderful Shabbat dinners together as a community and have had many, many programs. Due to the hard work of our office staff and many volunteers, we have programming similar to what is found at shuls with 400-500 families, whereas we have only 200 families.

Furthermore, we did this with an eye toward including everyone in our community. As president of our shul, I am often asked by members of the larger Jewish community: "how do we pull it all off?" The answer is simple: a great staff, an engaged community, and resourceful leaders make this possible. The volunteer spirit at Sinai is strong. As a matter of fact, over 90 people volunteered during our Purim weekend, which included a Battle of the Bands, two Megilla readings, a Purim carnival, and, as always at Sinai, a tasty

Persian feast. For those of you doing the math at home, that means nearly one out of every two families at the synagogue contributed to our success.

You may be wondering how a synagogue operates at such a high level, from a financial standpoint. After all, even though Sinai is a relatively small community, we do have expenses. You will notice that this year's budget is nearly \$800,000. In a few years, we probably will be running a budget of over a million dollars. Where does the money come from? In the last few years, our membership has increased quite a bit. However, if you look at the membership line of our budget, you will notice that the income for membership is down year over year, a reflection of the bad economy and more of our members needing assistance. In our synagogue's budget, if you factor out the Nursery School, membership revenues account for 54% of our overall revenue, and to meet next year's membership revenue goal, we have to increase our membership by at least 10 net households. What can you do to help us meet this goal? Invite unaffiliated friends to one of our educational or social programs. It's also never too early to start thinking about the high holidays or a child's b'nei mitzvah.

Our budget is also based on considerable fundraising. Last year, our annual campaign brought in \$55,000. This year, our budget requires \$60,000. I know that we can continue to pull together to increase our fundraising efforts led by Ed Fields. This year MM&M was a terrific financial success raising \$29,000, but, equally importantly, it was a fun night that brought together lots of people from within and outside our community. Next year the fundraising requirements are even greater. Additional funding will allow us to provide more quality programming to our growing membership, acknowledge our staff for their unbelievable efforts that have done so much for our community, and also meet rising costs. Consider thinking of events or activities that could be auctioned at MM&M and let Alisa Goldberg know of any ideas you may have or items you may want to contribute to the auction.

Looking forward for next year, I believe we will see an increased number of

children in our religious school due to the hard work of Kate Mueller and our religious school staff. USY hosted the Fall Kinnus in November and held monthly events. Rozita Tabibian led us in a successful first year of Jr. Kadima, and Senior Kadima also hosted some fun activities. Girl Scouts met twice per month and we added a new Brownie Troop. For our smallest members, a new Ima and Me program met every Wednesday in the nursery school, giving moms a place to meet and socialize with other new moms.

We also have seven new Chavurot that came about after our Chavurah Madness event, giving families a way of coming together to socialize and celebrate and strengthen our community.

Our programs this year were varied and fabulous. We held a Stargazing and S'mores party, a Fish Fry dinner, the Animal Celebration weekend sponsored and hosted by Bert & Suze Peters, a great Chanukah Lights and Laughter Havdallah, and Dinner and Storytelling with Joel Izzy, which drew almost 200 guests. One weekend, we hosted a Scholar-In-Residence with Stuart Schoffman, due to the generosity of Joe and Beth Green. He led two great discussions about Tikkun Olam in dangerous times.

I just wanted to take the opportunity to thank our fabulous Rabbi. His energy and enthusiasm are seen everywhere. I especially enjoy seeing him play the guitar with the religious school children on Sundays – and where else can you find such a Rockin' Rabbi at Purim? He can also be found teaching many enthusiastic adults during the Thursday Silicon Valley Beit Midrash sessions or the Mitzvah Initiative sessions.

We had six passover services this year and a wonderful Community Seder underwritten by Rina Katzen. The Tabibians hosted a wine tasting for Passover, giving us all an opportunity to try some excellent new kosher wines, many of which none of us were familiar with and which made great additions to our seders. Shabbat morning continues to be an important time in the life of the community and so do the Kiddush lunches following services. We have had 29 Shabbat Kiddush sponsored by members and we are thankful for the continued generous sponsorship of many

Kiddush by Shirley Landsman and a new contribution this year to sponsor 20 kiddush by the Sweedler family in memory of Susan's aunt, Rose.

Our Men's Club held successful movie nights at the Blue Light Cinema, poker night, and the ever popular Davening and Dunking session with Rabbis Fenton and Berkenwald. Sisterhood established new programming, including pottery at Petroglyph, a monthly Girl's Night Out which included dinner out at The Kitchen Table, dinner at a vegetarian restaurant, comedy night, and the popular monthly book club.

Looking ahead, one of the things that I believe we as a community need to pursue is a building fund. While the building is new and does not require much financial upkeep, this won't always be the case. If we start a fund now, it will have time to grow so that when we need to make a more costly repair, it will not have to come out of the operating budget, at the expense of programming or staff. In an effort to be conscientious both environmentally and fiscally, the synagogue board voted to install a solar electric system. This was the brainchild of members of one of our previous b'nei mitzvah classes. We expect the installation to begin at the end of May and to be finished in early July.

The other project I want to see us pursue this year is rewriting the bylaws of the synagogue to bring them into the 21st century. This will be a large task and next year I'll be asking you to vote affirmatively on these changes.

In addition, the Board is in need of a new Treasurer due to the departure of our very capable Treasurer, Jay Seliber, who will be relocating back to New Jersey at the end of the school year. If you are interested in taking on this important position, please contact me. The future for Congregation Sinai looks bright due to everyone's hard work. I look forward to sharing more simchas, b'nei mitzvot and community events with you in the coming year. May we all go from strength to strength in the coming year.

The registration for our summer program is going really well. We are very excited to have new families join our school. We really feel like a big part of the Congregation Sinai community.

The Challah Club (afternoon program) planted their spring garden last month. We reused old tires and planted lettuce, tomatoes, herbs, and flowers. The Narkis class planted corn and cucumbers, as well as pumpkins started from seeds. Thanks to the Levinson family for donating a beautiful tomato plant. The children enjoy digging in the dirt and caring for the plants, which

seem to be doing really well.

The first day of the school year will be on Monday, August 29. The week before, the staff will come to prepare the classrooms, learn and take a class in CPR and First Aid, as required by licensing. We are excited to meet the children and their parents on Friday, August 26.

Religious School

I had such an amazing first year at Congregation Sinai! As the school year comes to a close and the students are on summer vacation, I would like to reflect on what we have been able to achieve together. There are three main areas where we have seen a lot of success this year: curriculum development, community building, and Service attendance.

For me, there is nothing more important than the community aspect. This is so important to me because of my experiences as a kid: feeling awkward in school, and then going to synagogue and knowing I was part of something. I really had a sense that the members of my shul were there for me. I have tried to always demonstrate for the students what it means to be a community. For example, I'm always playing with the children on Shabbat to show that we have more of a connection to each other than just at school.

I also attend many of the students' school plays and sports events. The best indication of how strong our community has become over the past year came when students began inviting me to events in their lives outside of shul.

The curriculum in religious school education is very important when you think about the fact that these students are not getting formal Jewish education anywhere else. We currently have set instructional objectives for every subject and every grade. The holiday curriculum has specific art projects for each year, each with different learning goals, so that we add layers to their learning and avoid repetition. We also had a set prep time for teachers every week so that they could develop their lesson plans. Our curricula have allowed us to attain several important goals this year: all students starting in Kindergarten learned to write Hebrew in script letters, our current 3rd and 4th graders learned to read Hebrew, and

our 5th grade students have learned the entire Amidah.

One of my major initiatives this year was getting children to shul more often. I started with making a service attendance card for every Sinai child, including day school students. Every time I saw them in Shul I would give them a sticker on their card. I also devoted one of my earlier Voice articles to the "Whys" and "Whats" of service attendance. We experienced better and better attendance in Torah N' Tefillah with both day school and religious school students attending. This year, we handed out 45 certificates to students for completing their goals for service attendance (listed below).

I'm looking forward to beginning our second year together next year! I hope everyone has a great summer.




